



ABRAHAM LINCOLN'S LOG CABIN

What you need:

Pretzel sticks

Frosting

Paper Plate

Abraham Lincoln, the sixteenth president of the United States, was born in a one room log cabin.

Put a paper plate on the desk in front of you. Put some frosting on the side of a pretzel stick and place it, frosting down on the plate. Repeat this three more times, making a square shape with the pretzels. This is the foundation of the cabin.

Begin carefully building upwards, forming a square each time you build up a level. Each pretzel, or log, should have frosting on it to help hold the cabin together.

When you feel that the cabin walls are tall enough, lay pretzel sticks across the square to form the roof.
