

# Picture Cards with Boxes

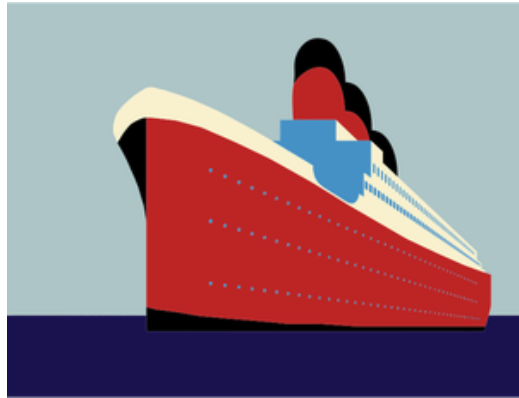
## Directions:

Print and cut out each card (laminating the cards will make them last longer).

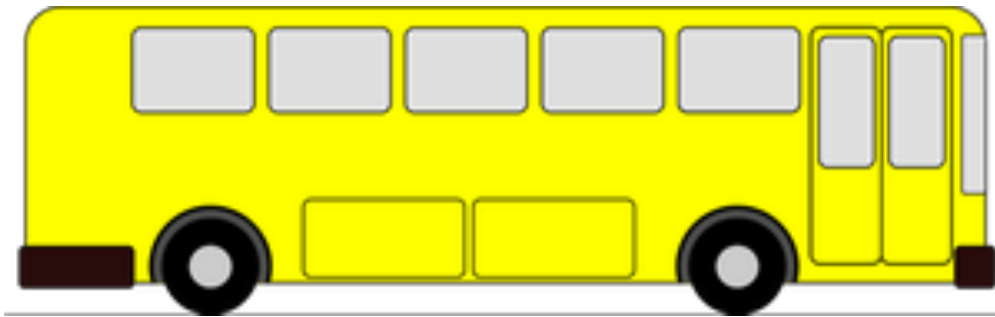
These cards can be used two different ways.

**1<sup>st</sup> way:** Use to boxes to identify how many sounds are in each word. You can use counters (or any kind of marker) or dry erase markers if you laminate the cards. Have your child place a counter or mark each box for every sound in the word.


**2<sup>nd</sup> way:** Have your child spell out the words using the boxes. This works best if the cards are laminated so they can be reused. You can also place the cards in sheet protectors so that you can write on them.




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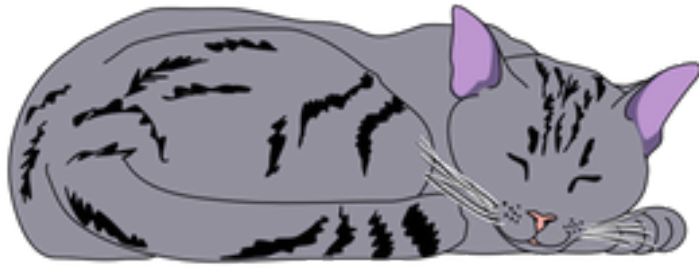
