For best results, print on cardstock and laminate the strips.

Cut out each of the strips on the following pages.

Have your child read one strip at a time. Accuracy is more important than speed so it's ok to read the same line over and over again.

The strips on page 3 with letters can be used two ways. You can have your child say each sound or have them read each letter.

The strips each practice a different skill, such as vowel sounds, blends, double consonants etc.

The strips with punctuation are great practice for your child to learn to read with emphasis.

The last two pages contain blank strips for you to fill in with your own content!
